PROCEDURES FOR BROKEN CHROMEBOOKS (pg. 15):

If a parent/guardian contacts the District about a broken Chromebook or device, our tech team will take a look at the device. If it is determined that the device has been physically damaged due to misuse, they will have the following options:

- 1) The District will have the device repaired but it will require a \$100 deposit and additional costs will be determined upon repair. A loaner device will be provided if necessary.
- 2) The parent/guardian can opt to have the device repaired themselves. If they require a loaner device, this will require a \$100 deposit.
- 3) If it is determined the damage was not a result of misuse, the District will provide a new device at no charge.

School Lunch/Breakfast: (pg. 42) On April 20, 2021 USDA issued waivers for the 2021-22 School Year. Through one of the waivers USDA has authorized Sponsors of the School Nutrition Program (SNP) to utilize the Seamless Summer Option (SSO) through the School Year 2021-2022. The Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE), Division of Food and Nutrition, (DFN) has received numerous questions regarding how to apply for SSO in the 21-22 School Year. Meals will be free again this year under the SSO grant.

EDUCATIONAL TRIPS (pg. 47) REMOVED: If the trip is to a COVID “hot-spot”, it is highly recommended that the student quarantine at home for a length of time determined by the Pennsylvania Department of Health. This recommendation is per the Pennsylvania Department of Education and Department of Health.

NHS TIMELINE

SAFE2SAY (Added to pg. 11)

What is Safe2Say Something?

Safe2Say Something is a youth violence prevention program run by the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General. The program teaches youth and adults how to recognize warning signs and signals, especially within social media, from individuals who may be a threat to themselves or others and to “say something” BEFORE it is too late. With Safe2Say Something, it’s easy and confidential to report safety concerns to help prevent violence and tragedies.

Here’s how it works:

- **Submit an anonymous tip report through the Safe2SaySomething system**
- **Crisis center reviews, assesses and processes all submissions**
- **Crisis center sends all submissions to school administration and/or law enforcement for intervention**
- **If needed, crisis center may contact tipster anonymously through the app**
